



Kirkland is planning for the next 20 years. Critical to that planning is evaluating the strengths and weaknesses of the City's transportation system and identifying future projects that respond to growth and keep Kirkland moving. To accomplish this, the City is developing a Transportation Master Plan (TMP).

What is the Transportation Master Plan?

The TMP will help identify and prioritize future transportation projects needed in Kirkland through the year 2035 that support safety, mobility, commerce, quality of life, and connectivity for all modes of transportation, including cars, transit, freight, bicyclists and pedestrians.

Why is the Transportation Master Plan needed?

The City Council has adopted a goal of reducing reliance on single occupancy vehicles and improving connectivity and multi-modal mobility to maintain or enhance travel times, safety, health, and transportation choices. The TMP will help identify ways to meet this goal.

The TMP will evaluate the effectiveness of the existing transportation system, identify needed improvements and potential funding sources, and explore how to maximize efficiency and provide transportation alternatives that increase mobility.

The TMP is also a critical component of the Comprehensive Plan Update process, which is currently underway.

What are Kirkland's Transportation Goals?

1. **Get people where they need to go** via walking, biking, transit and cars
2. **Link to land use** - Create a transportation system that is united with Kirkland's land use plan
3. **Be sustainable** - As the transportation system, is planned, built and maintained, provide mobility for all using reasonably assured revenue sources while minimizing environmental impacts
4. **Be an active partner** - Coordinate with a broad range of groups to meet Kirkland's transportation goals
5. **Transportation measurement** - Measure and report on progress toward achieving goals and actions
