Federal Economic Stimulus

- Congress working on language
- \$750+ billion (two years)
- Infrastructure Funding (\$100-\$150 billion?)
 - Roads, bridges & transit
 - Schools
 - Alternative energy & efficiency projects
- Focus on “shovel-ready” projects
- January 20 - > early February



City of Kirkland's Role

- Submitted project lists to State agencies, U. S. Conference of Mayors and others
- Funds may be distributed through state agencies or legislature or directly to large cities
- Much is still unknown
