HL—6	166	<b>Cotton Hill Park</b> —Build raised gravel trail to enhance walking conditions and help keep trail dry year round (approximately 750 feet of trail). Trail links Highlands Neighborhood to Crestwoods Park and is used by students walking to Kirkland Junior High. ✓ <b>Funded</b>	<b>\$5,000</b>
HL—3	141	<b>Entrance Enhancement</b> —Enhance entrance to neighborhood at 116 <sup>th</sup> Ave NE and NE 87 <sup>th</sup> St (big curve). Landscape with drought tolerant, low maintenance plants and either remove or refurbish kiosk. Design and plant selection to be made by the Neighborhood Association and Public Works Department. ✓ <b>Funded</b>	<b>\$2,500</b>
HL—1	139	<b>116<sup>th</sup> Walkway Improvement</b> —Widen and place a gravel path along the east side of 116 <sup>th</sup> just south of NE 94 <sup>th</sup> St. ✓ <b>Funded</b>	<b>\$15,000</b>
HL—2	128	<b>116<sup>th</sup> Walkway Improvement</b> —Asphalt a portion of the 116th Ave NE walkway between NE 88th and NE 94th Streets. (Original estimate \$8,200 so scope may be reduced.) ✓ <b>Funded</b>	<b>\$6,500</b>
<b>Total funds for projects approved</b>			<b>\$29,000</b>
HL—4	118	<b>Entrance Enhancement</b> —Enhance entrance to neighborhood at 112 <sup>th</sup> Ave NE and 87 <sup>th</sup> St (by railroad tracks). Landscape with drought tolerant, low maintenance plants and either remove or refurbish kiosk. Possibly include small neighborhood entrance sign. Design and plant selection to be made by the Neighborhood Association and Public Works Department.	<b>\$7,500</b>
HL—10	73	<b>Forbes Creek Park</b> —Patch and resurface both tennis (\$8,900) and basketball court (\$5,600). This project would address the long-term root problem and help the longevity of the court surface. Resurfacing and court restoration is done on a cyclical basis as part of the Park Department's ongoing work program. The tennis and basketball courts were resurfaced over three years ago. They are scheduled to be done in 2011–2012.	<b>\$14,500</b>
HL—8	71	<b>Spinney Homestead Park</b> —Remove roots and resurface asphalt walk where damaged along the perimeter walkway.	<b>\$2,500</b>
HL—9	58	<b>Cedar View Park</b> —Remove swings and install a play structure. Play structure to be chosen by neighborhood association in conjunction with the City's Park Department. Swings would be relocated to another City park (yet to be determined).	<b>\$9,000– \$25,000</b>
HL—7	55	<b>Cotton Hill Park</b> —Plan and fund Phase Two of Cotton Hill Park restoration, to include possibly renting goats again and purchasing native species to replace the invasive plants that are removed.	<b>\$1,000– \$4,000</b>
HL—11	54	<b>Stairs at Forbes Creek</b> —Rebuild stairs from north end of 116 <sup>th</sup> down to railroad tracks. Project to include purchase of materials, including wood timbers and gravel. Work to be done by neighborhood volunteers.	<b>\$7,000</b>
HL—5	50	<b>Highlands Park</b> —Install fence or barrier to stop balls from rolling into street and block cars from driving onto the grass.	<b>\$3,000– \$5,000</b>
HL—13	46	<b>Street Lighting</b> —Two street lights on 115 <sup>th</sup> PI NE (one at the intersection of 104 <sup>th</sup> and 115 <sup>th</sup> and the other at the bottom of the hill). Project contingent upon approval of adjacent property owners. Each power pole costs approximately \$6,000.	<b>\$12,000</b>
HL—12	28	<b>Street Lighting</b> —Add street light along 114 <sup>th</sup> (between NE 85 <sup>th</sup> and NE 87 <sup>th</sup> ) close to the neighborhood entrance sign.	<b>\$6,000</b>
HL—14	11	<b>Way finding signs for Highlands Walk</b> —Install directional arrow signs and route maps along selected route within neighborhood. Highlands walks can be linked to adjacent neighborhood walks.	<b>\$1,000– \$3,000</b>
