Chief Cameron

1942 - 1951



- Charlie Daniels- First Town Marshall in 1907
- Police Department established in 1936
- Chief Cameron was Kirkland's first police chief and had reportedly once ridden with Wyatt Earp
- Cameron often told his officers that Earp wasn't what he was portrayed to be. He said Earp only got into gun fights when he was assured a win

KPD 1940's - 1950's




Houghton Police

Merger - 1968



- The City of Houghton merged with Kirkland on July 31, 1968.



First "Policewoman" for KPD

Lee Seely



- Lee was appointed to the position in 1961 and served until 1969.
- Although she never worked Patrol by herself, she assisted officers with crimes that involved women and children. She also assisted in cases such as rapes and child neglect.

- It all started with K9 Jake







11 were killed from 2009 to date.


On average 2 Washington officers are killed per year.




