General Project Information

Project Name: 98th Ave NE Gravel Walkway Expansion

Location: 98th Ave NE, south of 110th Street

Project Estimate: \$30,000.

Description of the Safety Problem

- There is only a narrow (2 foot wide) walkway on the east side of 98th Ave NE, south of the 110th Street access down to the bridge (over Forbes Creek). This narrow walkway on this busy road is dangerous due to the close proximity and speed of vehicles and bike traffic coming down the hill. It is dangerous enough in the daylight when pedestrians are visible, and on dark rainy evenings, it is perilous. The rest of 98th Ave NE south to the intersection of Forbes Creek Drive has sidewalks or a barrier with traffic on this east side of the road.

Technical Evaluation (0–100 points)

- The east side of 98th Ave NE has only a 2 foot wide path of pavement between the edge of the bike lane and the grass and weeded area along the side of the road, extending about 500 feet. There is room for expansion of this walking area with sandy gravel to replace the grass and weeded area to allow a six foot wide walkway. A sidewalk would be too expensive, but a 4 foot wide gravel expansion to the existing paved walkway next to the street would give walkers a place to safely travel while being more removed from the 40 mph traffic. There is an existing row of city planted deciduous shrubs that would need to be trimmed in some areas to accommodate this pathway. A 20 foot section of the pavement by the bridge collects a 4-5" pond during rainy periods. If overlaid with asphalt it could be made to drain off to the side of the walkway.






EXISTING
