## General Project Information JNA NSP #2

**Project Description:** Extend the concrete sidewalk on the south side of NE 110<sup>th</sup> Street down the short steep section to the curve at 100<sup>th</sup> Ave NE. Expand the narrow gravel sidewalk to 5 foot wide along the west side of 100<sup>th</sup> Ave NE from NE 110<sup>th</sup> Steet north to 112<sup>th</sup> Street.

## Neighborhood and Community Benefit (0–20 points)

1. Please explain how the project will address a recognized safety need (especially with a vulnerable population) and result in a positive and lasting neighborhood and community benefit:

The concrete sidewalks along both sides of the improved 110<sup>th</sup> Street do not continue down the short steep section of the old neighborhood leaving children and adults to walk on the narrow side of the road in wet and dark weather on a curve. And along most of 100<sup>th</sup> Ave NE there is only a narrow gravel path right at the roads edge between NE 110<sup>th</sup> Steet and NE 112<sup>th</sup> Street, where the traffick accelerates. Creating a 5 foot wide gravel sidewalk back form the edge of the road in this old section of the nighborhood will allow children and adults to have good footing on the steep section and clearance from the car traffic in the dark wet weather and at night all year long.

This gravel sidewalk extension for over 2 city blocks for less tha \$30,000 is an excellent economy and should be used to multiply the limited sidewalk funds the City has available. It is only a fraction of the cost of poured concrete sidewalks.
