Track removal at 124th Street begins the week of Aug. 3

WHY: Project improves driving conditions and completes a final task of construction for Cross Kirkland Corridor



WHAT: Kirkland's contractor will remove the railroad tracks at Northeast 124th Street and Totem Lake Boulevard and repave the adjacent road sections. The project will also improve the sidewalks that line both road sections.

WHEN: Construction will begin the week of August 3 and is scheduled to be complete by the end of August. Typical hours of operation are Monday-Friday 8 p.m. to 6 a.m. Work within the street is limited to nonpeak hours 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

WHAT TO EXPECT: This is a very busy intersection and the City is requiring the majority of the work during the night. Cross Kirkland Corridor pedestrians and bicyclists are directed to use the signalized crossings at this intersection before, during and after construction.

■ Generally, one lane of traffic may be used by the contractor after 9 a.m. and before 3 p.m.



- The City of Kirkland requires the contractor to backfill and/or cover trenches and other unfinished work at the end of each day.
- There may be inconveniences associated with driving through the work zone; traffic control and flagging operations will be in effect.
- Access to the Cross Kirkland Corridor will remain open at all times.
- Access for emergency vehicles will be maintained throughout the construction process.
