## MRM PRIVATE AMENDMENT REQUEST SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT

### ADDENDUM

This addendum corrects errors in the text of the *MRM Private Amendment Request Final Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement*, issued February 13, 2014 by the City of Kirkland. The following arithmetic errors were discovered after the FSEIS had gone to print, but before the document was made publicly available online. As such, the errors only appear in a limited number of printed copies and CD's. The errors described below have been corrected in the version of the document available on the City's website. As noted below, the errors are minor and do not change any of the conclusions of the EIS.

#### Errata

**Page 3-3, Bullet 1** incorrectly states the share of employees who both work and reside in Kirkland as 19% and the number of employees who do not live in the city as 24,802. The text should read as follows:

- The Washington State Office of Financial Management (OFM) population estimate for the City of Kirkland in 2013 was 81,730 persons. In addition to this resident population, the Kirkland Police Department is responsible for providing services to non-residents who work in the community. According to City of Kirkland business license data, Kirkland was home to approximately 30,946 jobs in 2013. The US Census Bureau American Community Survey's data on commuter-adjusted daytime population and journey to work characteristics indicates that approximately ~~19%~~ 18.67% of employees working in Kirkland also reside in the city. The total population served by Kirkland Police therefore includes the following:
  - 81,730 residents; and
  - ~~24,802~~ 25,168 employees who do not live in the city (Discounted ~~19%~~ 18.67% from total Kirkland jobs of 30,946).

**Page 3-3, Bullet 2** incorrectly states the total service population of the Kirkland Police Department as 106,532. The text should read as follows:

- NORCOM reports that 25,868 calls for police service were received for Kirkland in 2012. Based on a combined residential and employment population served of ~~106,532~~ 106,898, calls for police service are equal to approximately 0.24 calls per capita (resident or employee) per year.

#### Conclusions

The errata described above are textual in nature and do not change any conclusions of the document.
