



TREE REMOVAL INFORMATION GUIDE

Use the following table to determine what tree form or permit you will need when requesting to remove significant trees on your property. Significant trees are trees with trunks greater than 6 inches in diameter, measured 4½ ft from the ground. Page 2 contains a brief description of each process.

*** Conditions that trigger a Tree Removal Permit**

- Request is for the removal of one or both of the last two significant trees remaining on the subject property.
- A property that has a new residence built within the last five years.
- A property containing a Native Growth Protection Easement (NGPE)
- A property within 100 feet of a critical area (i.e. streams, slopes with a grade 15% or greater, and wetlands)
- A property containing subdivision restrictions listed on deed or plat map
- A property removing a tree along the shoreline of Lake Washington

An arborist report from a qualified professional must be submitted with your permit (see Qualified Professional section below).



PERMIT AND FORM DESCRIPTIONS

Tree Removal Notification

This form is for tree removal requests on private property that have no conditions (see Conditions description above). There are no fees associated with this form.

Tree Removal Permit Application

This permit is for the removal of more than two trees or for the removal of trees on a site with conditions (see Conditions description above). A fee of \$200.00 is required. While an arborist report is generally required with this permit an applicant may submit photos for trees with obvious defects or for tree causing damage to property. Arborist reports must be done by a qualified professional. See the description of qualified professional below.

Public Tree Removal & Pruning Permit Applications

These permits are for either the pruning or removal of street (public) trees. Pruning requests have no fees, but an ISA certified arborist is required to perform the pruning of public trees following ANSI A300 Standards when the Public Works Department is not able to perform the pruning. Removal of public trees requires an arborist report by a qualified professional (see the description of qualified professional below). A fee of \$200.00 is required for processing a public tree removal request.

Forest Management Plan

This permit is for large wooded sites requesting to remove more than two trees or if the site has conditions (see Conditions description above). The site must be significantly wooded (over 40% canopy coverage) and be at least 35,000 square feet. This requires an arborist report from a qualified professional (see the description of qualified professional below). A fee of \$300.00 is required for processing a forest management plan.

Qualified Professional

Qualified professionals are individuals with relevant education and training in arboriculture or urban forestry, having two or more of the following credentials:

- International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) Certified Arborist
- Tree Risk Assessor Certification (TRACE) as established by the Pacific Northwest Chapter of ISA (or equivalent)
- American Society of Consulting Arborists (ASCA) registered Consulting Arborist
- Society of American Foresters (SAF) Certified Forester for Forest Management Plans
