PROJECT UPDATE



CARING FOR YOUR INFRASTRUCTURE TO KEEP KIRKLAND HEALTHY, SAFE AND VIBRANT



WHY: New sewer and water mains will replace aging systems and increase flow capacity

WHAT: The City of Kirkland is upgrading the water and sewer mains along Northeast 80th Street, from 116th Avenue Northeast to 132nd Avenue Northeast.

FEATURES: The project will replace the aging eight-inch water main with 20-inch water main. It will replace the aging eight-inch sewer main with a 12-inch sewer main.

WHEN: Construction is likely to begin in the April 2016 and to continue into early fall.

WHAT TO EXPECT: The work will require intermittent lane-closures along the corridor. Kirkland is establishing a traffic control plan for residents who are driving, walking and riding a bicycle. Crews can work between 7:30 a.m. and 5 p.m.

- The City of Kirkland requires the contractor to backfill and/or cover trenches and other unfinished work at the end of each day.

■ Access for mail delivery, garbage pick-up and emergency vehicles will be maintained
