Project Update

July 2009

Who: The City of Kirkland along with the contractor, Lakeside Industries, will be resurfacing several streets around Kirkland.

Where: The construction map on the back of this flyer indicates the streets in your area that have been selected for resurfacing this year. Specific schedule information will be posted in early July and updated periodically on the City's website www.ci.kirkland.wa.us (search Street Preservation). It is possible that construction schedules may change due to weather conditions.

When: Construction for the 2009 Street Overlay Project is scheduled to begin in mid-July and continue into early fall.

What to Expect: Over the past several months, City street crews have been repairing damaged pavement in preparation for the resurfacing. Other preparation work that will be performed by the contractor includes replacing sections of broken curb and sidewalk, as well as installing sidewalk ramps that meet the current requirements of the Americans With Disabilities Act.

Inconvenience caused by construction will be minimized to the extent possible. However, some delays and temporary lane or full road closures will be necessary in order to complete the work. Emergency vehicle access will be maintained at all times throughout the work. Lakeside Industries will schedule activities around regular garbage/recycling pick-up schedules. Notices will be distributed to all adjacent residents and businesses prior to paving.

In some locations, it may be necessary to limit driveway access for 3 days while fresh concrete is allowed to cure. If your driveway is affected, you will be specifically notified prior to work being performed. Water is harmful to all pavement repair treatments. Please avoid washing vehicles or watering adjacent lawns on the date work is scheduled.

Why: Preventative maintenance not only prolongs the life of a street but saves money by improving the street before it reaches the final state of its life when rapid deterioration occurs. After the overlay, the street will look very much like it did when it was new, and will again be able to withstand the effects of traffic and weather. Preventative maintenance saves the taxpayers money.

How You Can Help:

Your cooperation in ensuring the area of roadway affected by the project is not obstructed with vehicles or other items is greatly appreciated. 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


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
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
Juanita: NE 124th Street from 100th Avenue NE to NE 123rd Street
