



Street Overlay Coming Soon

2013 Street Preservation Program

What: As part of our annual Street Preservation Program, the City of Kirkland is pleased to announce that the contractor, Watson Asphalt, will be resurfacing portions of seven streets in Kirkland. Thanks to the Street Levy voted in by residents in 2012, the City is able to *double* the number of arterial streets to be paved each year. This preventative maintenance program not only prolongs the life of a street, but will save money by improving the street surface before it reaches the final state when rapid deterioration occurs and full reconstruction is required. After the overlay is complete, the street will look very much like it did when it was new, and will again be able to withstand the effects of traffic and weather.

Where/When: The first phase of the Overlay Program began in April with concrete repairs and installation of new Americans with Disabilities (ADA) ramps at intersections and crosswalks. The actual overlay is scheduled to begin June 24, with this anticipated schedule (weather permitting):

1. 108th Ave NE from NE 53rd St W to NE 68th St	Jun 24 – Jul 29
2. State St S from 5th Ave S to Kirkland Ave	Jul 18 – Aug 12
3. NE 116th St from 98th Ave NE to 108th Ave NE	Aug 13 – Sep 11
4. 97th Ave NE from Juanita Drive to NE 119th Way	Aug 13 – Sep 11
5. NE 132nd St from 124th Ave NE to 132nd Ave NE	Aug 30 – Sep 20
6. NE 145th St from 100th Ave NE to Juanita-Wood. Way NE	Sep 12 – Oct 8
7. Simonds Rd NE from 92nd Ave NE to 100th Ave NE	Sep 12 – Oct 8

Specific schedule information for each street will be posted and updated periodically on the City's website www.kirklandwa.gov (search *Street Preservation*). It is possible that construction schedules change due to weather conditions. Typical hours of operation are Monday-Friday 7:00 am to 5:00 pm. Two lanes of traffic will be maintained prior to 9:00 am and after 3:30 pm.

What to Expect:

Grinding existing asphalt: A few inches of existing asphalt will be ground off prior to paving in order to make room for the new pavement. During this phase, the roadway is rough and traffic speeds are reduced.

Alternative Formats: Persons with disabilities may request materials in alternative formats. Persons with hearing impairments may access the Washington State Telecommunications Relay Service at 711. **Title VI:** It is the City of Kirkland's policy to ensure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 by prohibiting discrimination against any person on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the provision of benefits and services resulting from programs and activities. Any person who believes his/her Title VI protection has been violated, may file a complaint with the City of Kirkland. 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Pavement Repair: In some areas where the existing asphalt pavement is severely damaged, it needs to be removed and replaced all the way down to the base.

Asphalt repaving: There may be inconveniences associated with driving through the work zone; traffic control and flagging operations will be in effect. The project inspector will be on site to help coordinate access and answer any questions on the day of work.

Advanced notice of lane closures and parking restrictions:

During construction: Notices will be distributed or signs will be posted for adjacent residents and businesses within 24 hours prior to paving.

Parking: "No-Parking" signs will be posted 24 hours in advance of all parking restrictions. **The City will have vehicles towed at the owner's expense if they are left on the street after the 24 hour notice period.** Please do not leave vehicles parked on the street while on vacation.

Garbage and mail services: The contractor will schedule activities around regular garbage/recycling pick-up schedules. In rare cases, your mail could be delayed a day. If your mail is delayed, it will always be available to pick up at the post office the day of or will be delivered to your mailbox the next day.

Emergency access: Emergency vehicle access will be maintained throughout the construction process. The contractor is required to backfill and/or cover their work at the end of each day so there will be no open trenches left over night.


