1	Pay station token policy	Establish a policy for the use of tokens in pay stations. At what rate should they be discounted to merchants, how should they be distributed, etc.	Staff	High
2	Sunday free notification	Parking regulation signs do not say that Sunday is un-regulated. There are various methods for achieving this with various costs.	KDL?	Medium
3	Policies on 30 min, 15 min and loading zones	Uniform policies are needed to govern the institution of these zones.	Parking study	High (two requests pending)
4	Garage security and safety	Library garage is perceived to be unsafe. This is a deterrent to usage. Develop a prioritized proposal for improvements.	Various	Medium
5	Brochure	Summary of Parking plan	PAB	Underway
6	Park smart legislation	Park smart does not require employees to be registered except at the time of business license review. This makes it difficult to enforce. Rules need to be re-written.	Various	Medium
7	Leases for public lots	Secure leases and make appropriate improvements for public use of private lots	Parking study	Underway
8	Study opening lower garage level for general use.	It may be possible to open the lower level of the garage for use during times when the upper level is full and the lower level is under utilized. This includes resigning the ramp with clearer signs.	Parking study	Low
9	Study implementation of a higher mix of 10 hour stalls in zones C and D.	Change from 2 hour zones. Study calls for usage and capacity studies to determine how changes are made	Parking study	Low
10	Develop implementation plan for parking lost to redevelopment/temporary interruptions.	Identify sites to compensate for temporary loss of stalls at Lake and Central and during construction.	Parking study	Underway
11	Reevaluate and refine current fee-in-lieu option	Perhaps relaxing minimum parking requirements and increasing contributions to fee in-lieu is helpful.	Parking study	Low
12	Encourage private sector development of parking and/or implementation of TDM programs	Develop policy that allows certain incentives if specific public parking and transportation goals are met through development	Parking study	Low
13	Financial planning	Understand current finances. Make policy recommendations to Council.	PAB	Underway
