Call to Order

Chair Liengboonlertchai called meeting to order at 7:31 a.m.

Approval of January meeting notes.

Car Show

This year's organizers requested closures to the Lake & Central and Lakeshore Plaza parking lots. In addition, closure to Marina Park at noon on Saturday for a 50's dance. Main Street and the Park & Main lot will be open all weekend.

Work Items

1. License reader: Start date is projected for June, no grace period will be extended since the device is only replacing chalking. PD will develop an article for the media and will see that emails get out to businesses of the coming device. Enforcement will carry flyers to give patrons also.
2. Variable/Event parking: Board discussed valet parking at Park & Main and library garage on Sunday of the Car Show.
3. Pay Parking: Recap stakeholders meeting, respond to their questions, do more outreach with some key people such as, Pat, Vince, Georgie and Bonnie. Originally the PAB proposed an 11 am start time; the board would like to remain consistent with Park & Main lot and all timed parking by starting at 9 am instead. Council memo is due on April 7th for the April 19th council meeting. The board will review the final memo at the next PAB meeting.
4. Parking requirements: No discussion at this time.

Economic Development Committee

Prepare pay parking talking points for Councilmember Greenway. Stuart McLeod is willing to speak with the City, traffic impacts on Main St/Kirkland Ave should be considered. A and Jack will attend the next meeting on March 28th.

Park & Main monthly parking

Both Cobalt Mortgage and Microsoft have now secured monthly parking at Park Place. Microsoft is looking at possibly needing more. Marilyn Dillard has agreed to a "group" monthly rate of a minimum of three parkers at a reduced rate of \$80/mo/space.

Monthly Parking Report

Board noticed the Lake & Central revenue was down from last year – perhaps because there's been an increase of unoccupied retail space on Central Way and Lake Street.
