

Kirkland Considers Expanding Pay Parking in two City owned lots

Parking User Survey Helps City Decide About Daytime Pay Parking

The City of Kirkland acknowledges the challenges of providing the right number and cost of parking in downtown Kirkland. It is aware that employees often park in customer spaces because they are the most convenient. The City recognizes that customers may not find convenient parking in downtown Kirkland.

So what is the City doing about it?

It's considering expanding pay parking into the daytime hours and wants to hear from parking patrons about it.

Benefits of Pay Parking

The most notable benefit is customer turnover. Other benefits include revenue to expand future parking supply and maintenance of current parking facilities. It also increases consistency and reduces confusion with the current evening only pay parking lots.

Proposal to Expand Pay Parking

To achieve consistency, convenience, and parking turn-over, the City is considering extending current evening pay hours (5 p.m. to 9 p.m., \$1/hour) to full-day pay hours (9 a.m. to 9 p.m., \$1/hour).

Survey Will Help Future Decision
