

A guide to Pedestrian and Bicycle survey responses

Beginning in July people have taken the Bicycle and Pedestrian Surveys.

The survey had a number of questions, but three questions generated hundreds of comments. In summary these questions asked:

1. What are problematic locations for biking and pedestrians?
2. What are some excellent locations for biking and pedestrians?
3. What other things could be done to improve biking or walking?

Fourteen .pdf files have been prepared that describe the responses to these questions, seven each for both bikes and pedestrians.

- Raw data from the responses, this file has answers to all three questions in an excel format.
- Three documents, one document for each of the three questions. These have been sorted into categories to better understand the things that are important to respondents.
- Three graphs one for each of the three questions. These are coordinated with the documents to show graphically how the responses break down.

For the most part these files represent responses through early to mid August. The raw data files have responses through September 21. All the files are in PDF format.

Our plan is to evaluate the comments and develop appropriate changes to programs, projects and policies.
