What is bike share?



Kirkland's proposed permit - overview

- 12-mo permit pilot, with 6-mo evaluation period
- Fixed permit fee
- Also a variable administrative fee, charged per bike: \$15
 - Funds go toward staff time
 - *Requires council approval*
- Includes Parks and CKC

Companies	# of bikes
LimeBike	200 (100 standard + 100 ebike)
Ofo	100
Spin	100
Total	400

Permit Requirements



Data reporting

- Weekly averages of # of bikes on the ground to monitor compliance with target # we're allowing
- Receive reports monthly
- Daily ride numbers
