

PROJECT UPDATE



CARING FOR YOUR INFRASTRUCTURE TO KEEP KIRKLAND HEALTHY, SAFE AND VIBRANT



Kirkland begins in May upgrading the 120th Avenue Northeast water main between Northeast 80th and 85th streets.

Water main upgrade ensures reliability

WHAT: A water main and stormwater system upgrade project will close a section of 120th Avenue Northeast, from Northeast 80th to Northeast 85th streets during work hours, starting in June and ending in the fall. However, mail delivery, local residents, waste management and emergency response will continue to have access to the street.

The new 20-inch water main, which contracted crews will be installing, will complement the 24-inch water main Kirkland installed in 2015 beneath Northeast 85th Street and the 20-inch main Kirkland installed the following year beneath Northeast 80th Street. It will also provide system redundancy for the conveyance of drinking water and fire flows, in case of an emergency. The stormwater pipe will extend

WHEN: Shoreline Construction's crews will be working between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m., Monday through Friday, starting in June. Shoreline's schedule shows project completion in September.

WHAT TO EXPECT: Installation will require Shoreline Construction to dig a trench along 120th Avenue Northeast.

- After the contractor has installed the water and stormwater pipes, its crews will patch and pave the roadway. This will require a forecasted period of dry weather. Forecasts of wet weather will delay the paving process.

- Puget Sound Energy and Shoreline Construction will be working nights near 120th Avenue Northeast's intersection with Northeast 85th Street.

- Shoreline will provide access for local residents, mail delivery, garbage pick-up and emergency vehicles.
