

PROJECT UPDATE



CARING FOR YOUR INFRASTRUCTURE TO KEEP KIRKLAND HEALTHY, SAFE AND VIBRANT



To improve neighborhood access for people while they are walking, bicycling and driving, the City of Kirkland is reconfiguring Northeast 132nd Street's intersection with 136th Avenue Northeast with shorter crossing distances, sidewalk and new channelization.

Work begins on improving neighborhood access

Measures will calm traffic, remove street parking and shorten crosswalk distance

WHAT: Construction begins June 8 on a project that will improve walking, bicycling and driving through Northeast 132nd Street's intersection with 136th Avenue Northeast.

To the intersection, Kirkland's contractor will add a turn-pocket, a pair of bike lanes, a section of sidewalk and a bulbout, which will narrow the crossing distance from one side of 136th Avenue Northeast to the other.

This will create better access for the nearby neighborhoods.

WHEN: FORMA Construction's crews will work from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. FORMA plans to begin work in early June and to complete the project by August. The contractor's schedule depends significantly on how COVID-19 affects its crew's ability to work.

WHAT TO EXPECT: FORMA Construction is planning to stage its equipment on the Olympic Pipeline property on the southwest

corner of Northeast 132nd Street and 136th Avenue Northeast.

- COVID-19 could force FORMA Construction to suspend work at any point or delay the start of work. If so, crews will restore any disturbed areas of public use to usable conditions. The contractor would resume work as soon as conditions allow.
- The contractor will maintain access for local residents, mail delivery, garbage pick-up and emergency vehicles.
- The intersection's new channelization will eliminate street parking for automobiles on the north side of Northeast 132nd Street.

Park renovation starts end of 2021

The 132nd Square Park Master Plan that Kirkland's city council approved in December will become a construction project at the end of 2021. Among other improvements, the project will replace the soccer field's grassy—and sometimes muddy—surface with a synthetic turf surface that would be playable all year, including during wet weather.

To save costs, Kirkland's leaders are timing the park renovation project with the installation of a stormwater system beneath the park's ballfield. The stormwater system will consolidate and treat stormwater run-off from the surrounding 48.5 acres. The project will require a 10-foot-deep hole in the northern section of the soccer field. Construction begins 2020 on bike, ped bridge

Totem Lake drivers will continue to experience traffic delays on Totem Lake Boulevard this month while contractors from the City of Kirkland continues to prepare the urban center for its expanding population of workers and residents.

Marshbank Construction is still closing at least three of Totem Lake Boulevard's five lanes between 120th

Avenue Northeast and Northeast 124th Street until May while its crews rebuild the road and install a new retaining wall that will help support the road.

Marshbank's crews are also closing lanes sections of 120th Avenue Northeast and Totem Lake Way while they rebuild the sidewalk and roadway. For more information, visit www.kirklandwa.gov/totemlake
