

Sidewalk construction begins in July

New walkway will provide safer walking and bicycling route to Peter Kirk Elementary

WHAT: A-1 Landscaping and Construction, Inc., begins work in mid-July on more than 850 linear feet of sidewalk along the north side of Northeast 95th Street, between 112th and 116th avenues northeast. The new sidewalk will connect to sections of existing sidewalk.

WHEN: A-1 Landscaping and Construction's crews will be working from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday until November. At times, the contracted crews may work until 6 p.m.

WHAT TO EXPECT: The new sidewalk will replace some landscaping within the City's right-of-way, as well as many of the gravel areas that residents use for parking. However, street parking space will still be available when the sidewalk

is complete.

- The contractor will cover trenches and other unfinished work at the end of each day.
- Flaggers will help people navigate the roadway.
- The contractor will maintain access for mail delivery, garbage pick-up, local residents and emergency vehicles.
- Construction will, at times, eliminate some street parking and affect driveways.





Sidewalk construction begins in July

New walkway provides safer walking and bicycling route to school

WHAT: Landscaping and Construction, Inc., begins work in July on more than 1,700 linear feet of sidewalk along the south side of Northeast 104th Street, between 128th and 132nd avenues northeast. The new sidewalk will connect to the existing sidewalk along the south side of the street.

WHEN: Landscaping and Construction's crews will be working from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday until November. At times, the contracted crews may work until 6 p.m.

WHAT TO EXPECT: The new sidewalk will replace some landscaping that is in the City of Kirkland's right-of-way, as well as many of the gravel areas—also in the right-of-way—that residents use for parking. However, street parking space will still be available on both sides of the street.

- The contractor will backfill and/or cover trenches and other unfinished work at the end of each day.
- Flaggers will be present, if necessary, to help residents walk across the street to avoid the construction zone.
- The contractor will maintain access for mail delivery, garbage pick-up, local residents and emergency vehicles.
- Construction will, at times, eliminate some street parking and affect driveways.





New walkway will provide safer walking, bicycling route to Mark Twain Elementary

WHAT: Landscaping and Construction, Inc., begins work in mid-July on more than 580 linear feet of sidewalk along the west side of 126th Avenue Northeast, between Northeast 90th and 95th streets. The new sidewalk will connect to sections of existing sidewalk along the west side of the street.

WHEN: Landscaping and Construction’s crews will be working from 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday until November. At times, the contracted crews may work until 6 p.m.

WHAT TO EXPECT: The new sidewalk will replace some landscaping within the City’s right-of-way, as well as many of the gravel areas—also in the right-of-way—that residents use for parking. However, street parking

space will still be available on both sides of the street.

- The contractor will cover trenches and other unfinished work at the end of each day.

- Construction will, at times, eliminate some street parking and affect driveways.


