Call to Order

Chair Neir called the meeting to order at 6:02. Members Present: Tess Pate, John Perlic, Mike Snow, Carl Wilson, Sandeep Singhal, Lisa McConnell, Kirkland Staff Present: David Godfrey, Dave Snider, Kathy Brown, Rod Steitzer, Public Works Department.

Approval of meeting notes from January, 2014 meetings.

Notes were approved unanimously.

Public Comment

Glen Buhlmann urged the Commission to include a vision zero safety policy in the Transportation Master Plan and he voiced support for dynamic parking charges rather than free parking.

Transportation Master Plan

Staff presented information about project selection for a 20 year project list that is included in the Transportation Master Plan. In a lengthy discussion, the Commission worked through several project categories. Some points that were brought out included: interest in previous spending amounts, policy support from other Master Plans, and the need for more direction on CKC categories.

The Commission agreed that another meeting was needed, in addition to the March 25 meeting if the discussion is to be completed by the end of March. Staff was directed to poll the Commission for meeting dates in the near future.

Updates from Commissioners

Staff discussed Impact Fees and was asked to email information about Impact Fees to the Commission. Staff updated the Commission on the downtown parking study discussions. The date for the June 25 public hearing on the Transportation Master Plan was also discussed.

Wilson discussed Express Toll lanes on I-405. The Commission agreed that an update was not needed but that it would be helpful, to hear from the WSDOT on how tolling was going to be assessed and what the options for changes would be. McConnell reported on the Cascade Bicycle Club activities on the Eastside and on the Feet First Summit that is being held on April 2.
