Call to Order

Vice Chair Neir called the meeting to order at 6:02. Members Present: Tess Pate, Tom Pendergrass, John Perlic, Mike Snow, Carl Wilson. Kirkland Staff Present: David Godfrey, Rod Steitzer, Public Works Department.

Approval of meeting notes from June 25, 2014 meeting.

100th Avenue Study

Rod Steitzer described the study that covers 100th Avenue NE from NE 132nd Street to NE 145th Street. He also described a design grant that has been recently received for the same segment. The study was being reviewed by the Commission before being submitted to the City Council for consideration. A handout was distributed describing the project scope. The Commission asked several questions and raised several points for Council consideration including: Width of the right-of-way, 3 lane versus 5 lane cross-section, surface water (underground stream), and access control.

Transportation Master Plan

The Commission reviewed a preliminary draft of the Goals and Policies for the Transportation Master Plan. The Commission went through the document page by page and had numerous comments, corrections and suggestions. These will be incorporated into the next version of the document. The Commission was encouraged to submit any additional comments to staff by email.

Updates from Commissioners and Staff

Staff reported on the following items

Promenade Council item: on July 15 Staff and Commissioner Neir presented the Lake Washington Promenade concept to the City Council. Council voted to include a possible study in the Transportation Master Plan.

Sound Transit Long Range Plan also at the July 15 Council meeting staff presented a draft letter to Sound Transit, commenting on the Long Range Plan Draft Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement.

Flashing yellow arrows Staff reported that the Public Works and Parks Committee of Council accepted the recommendations that were presented to the Transportation Commission.

There were no reports from Commissioners.
