
The Book Club meets the 1st Wednesday of each month at the Peter Kirk Community Center from 12:30-1:30pm. Everyone is welcome!



Murder at the Flamingo by Rachel McMillan






The author of the Agatha and Macavity Award–winning Rei Shimura novels brings us an atmospheric new historical mystery with a captivating heroine.

Postmortem by Patricia Cornwell





A Murder in Time by Julie McElwain





#1 internationally bestselling author Sara Blaedel delivers an electrifying, page-turning new novel in which detective Louise Rick confronts a case that will change her life forever.



Miss Pinkerton by Mary Roberts Rinehart







When five colleagues are forced to go on a corporate retreat in the wilderness, they reluctantly pick up their backpacks and start walking down the muddy path.


But one of the women doesn't come out of the woods. And each of her companions tells a slightly different story about what happened.

The Red Notebook by Antoine Laurain




