A rapid flashing beacon will provide a safe way for pedestrians to cross east/west along a heavily used road at the base of sloped hill that impedes visibility of the intersection. This would provide safer passage across 141<sup>st</sup> street for students walking to Thoureau Elementary School and Finn Hill Middle School, as well as commuters utilizing the public transit stop at that location.
