This project will include the painting of a new crosswalk at the corner of Waverly Way and 2nd Street West, near the entrance to the public tennis courts at the north end of Heritage Park. It will also include the installation of a sidewalk ramp on the West side of Waverly Way for pedestrian and ADA access. Pending a lighting study, it may include the adjustment of the existing streetlight to provide adequate lighting to the crosswalk.

Currently, there is only one marked crosswalk across Waverly Way (at the corner of Market and Waverly Way) to provide safe pedestrian access to Heritage Park. There is no other marked signage or crosswalks that allow pedestrians to cross Waverly Way from the Market Neighborhood sidestreets into Heritage Park. Market neighborhood residents will benefit from safer access to the north end of the park and tennis courts.
