Finally, the crosswalk also leads directly to a bus stop on the south side of 132nd. Folks on the North side of the road need to get safely across an increasingly busy NE 132nd, especially during the morning and evening commute times.

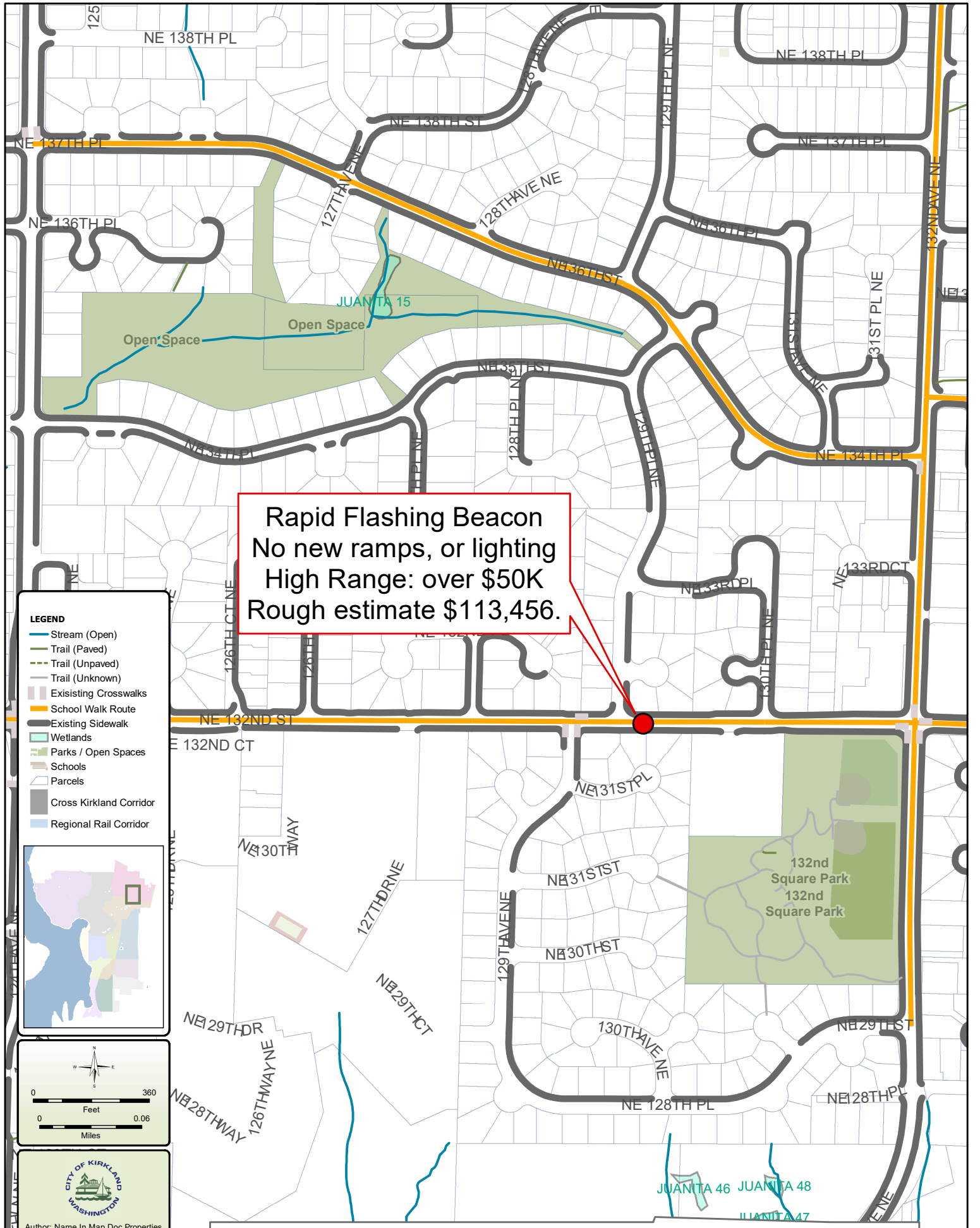
