A rapid flashing beacon will be the only addition that is needed for this location. Since there is already a crosswalk at this location, there is no need to level the walking surface, add ramps, or eliminate a raised curb.

Children who attend Finn Hill Middle School and Thoreau Elementary School use this crosswalk on their school walk route. The speed limit on this road is 35 mph and it is a main thoroughfare to egress out of the neighborhood with 4000-5000 cars/day. There is a flashing beacon north of the 137th intersection along 84th, but no walkway on the east side of the road connecting 137th to where the northern crosswalk is by the school. Children walking or biking to school must choose to either walk in the street to get to the northern flashing beacon, or cross at this unsafe crosswalk, with no crossing guard. This crossing also leads right to a trailhead at Big Finn Hill Park and is used heavily by the community.
