The current walkway angles from a straight path down to the roadway and gets very close to the road to avoid the storm drain catch basin. This all appears to have been done to avoid disturbing city property that the adjacent home owner has put grass and some boulders upon. Also, the mail box placement puts the box owners into the street to access their mail. This walkway is used daily by students from Lake Washington High School and is the walk access from the entire street to access local businesses on NE 85th street. This change would improve safety, make it easier in a straight line for any handicapped person and provide the only safe way between NE 80th and NE 85th since the west side of 122 Ave NE has no sidewalk in this stretch of road.
