PURPOSE?

Establish a 'best-in-class' economic and trade development organization for broad-based job creation and opportunity in the Puget Sound region.

WHY?

We are in a globally competitive environment. Boeing 777X and Amazon HQ2 reinforced we need to work together as one region to compete.

WHAT?

- ✓ **One Region:** Companies look at regions when considering expansion and location.
- ✓ **Research and Analysis:** Need great research and analysis to tell our story, understand our competition and support businesses.
- ✓ **Storytelling:** Marketing messages need to be consistent, targeted and told at a regional level to national and international businesses.

Public Sector
