## Kingsgate Park and Ride

### Project Overview

A new 600-stall Kingsgate parking garage will be built at the Kingsgate Park-and-Ride. The garage is one of three new/expanded parking facilities that will be built in the I-405 corridor, to support the Sound Transit Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Project. BRT is part of Sound Transit's regional transit system expansion plan, ST3, which was approved by voters in the fall of 2016.

The I-405 BRT Project will service a 37-mile corridor from Lynnwood to Burien. The 11 BRT stops will expand across 8 cities. BRT ridership is estimated to reach 15,000-18,000 daily riders by 2040.



### Planning phase

Conceptual Engineering and Environmental Review

Sound Transit's work in 2019 will consist of conceptual engineering and environmental review for the I-405 BRT project. This includes the work at the Totem Lake Station and the parking structure at the Kingsgate Park and Ride.

### The BRT Parking Structure at Kingsgate will:

- Add 400 parking spaces
- Increase regional mobility
- Support safe and convenient access for multiple modes
- Encourage equitable transit-oriented development

### Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) Feasibility Study

During 2018 WSDOT and Sound Transit, worked with City of Kirkland and other key stakeholders to determine the feasibility for TOD at Kingsgate as mandated by the legislature in 2017. The study, completed in November 2018 helps to inform both the I-405 BRT Project planning and delivery process as well as the potential for future TOD in this location.

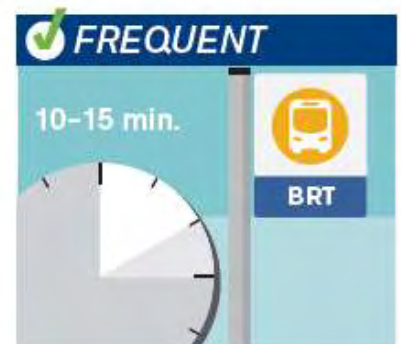


### Fast, Frequent, Reliable Service

## Route and stations

I-405 BRT will stop at 11 stations including a new South Renton Transit Center:

- › **Lynnwood City Center Station**  
(connecting to Link light rail)
- › **Canyon Park (Bothell)**
- › **UW Bothell/Cascadia College**
- › **Brickyard (Bothell)**
- › **Totem Lake/Kingsgate (Kirkland)**  
(with expanded parking)
- › **NE 85th Street (Kirkland)**
- › **Bellevue Transit Center**  
(connecting to Link light rail)
- › **NE 44th Street (Renton)**  
(with new parking)
- › **South Renton Transit Center**  
(new transit center with parking)
- › **Tukwila International Blvd Station**  
(connecting to Link light rail)
- › **Burien Transit Center**

*\*Construction for most of the BRT project is expected to begin by 2023 and be completed by 2024. Construction of some elements may begin before 2023, and others may occur after service starts in 2024.*
