The City of Kirkland is planning a series of bicycling and walking improvements in spring along Northeast 131st Way and 90th Avenue Northeast.

Goodwill Hill project begins mid-July

Contractor will improve walking, bicycling and driving conditions along corridor

WHAT: A Kirkland contractor is planning to begin construction in mid-July on a project that will improve the walking, bicycling and driving conditions along 90th Avenue Northeast and Northeast 131st Way.

Apcon-Tech plans by December to complete the improvements between 97th Avenue Northeast and Northeast 134th Street.

Until then, the contractor will be widening the corridor's walking and bicycling pathway and replacing the broken curb that establishes the pathway.

Apcon-Tech will re-install guardrail posts in areas where the original posts have suffered damage, modify pavement markings to alert drivers that people could be walking and bicycling along the street. The contractor will also install three street lights.

WHEN: Apcon-Tech plans to work from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., Monday through Friday, starting the week of July 17. Apcon-Tech is planning to complete the project by December.

WHAT TO EXPECT: Here is where we prepare folks for the reality of construction: staging area, lane-closures; road-closures; banging, etc.

Construction begins in early August on 100th Ave. NE

A Kirkland contractor expects to begin construction in August on a series of ambitious improvements that will transform the 100th Avenue Northeast corridor into a safer, more efficient street for all traveling modes, including walking, bicycling and driving.

To prepare for this work, Puget Sound Energy is currently relocating its gas lines along the corridor.

In this phase of the project, the City is building separated sidewalks and elevated bicycle lanes along both sides of the corridor, between Northeast 139th and 145th streets. This phase will also improve traffic flow by creating two more automotive lanes and optimizing 100th Avenue Northeast's intersections with Northeast 139th, 145th streets and Simonds Road.

The City of Kirkland completed in 2020 one of the first phase's most ambitious tasks: installation of a new 10-foot-wide, eight-foot-tall culvert that will accommodate those extra two lanes of traffic and, at the same time, is providing access to a mile of upstream habitat for trout and salmon.

Juanita Drive work begins spring 2024

Kirkland's staff and consulting engineers are wrapping up the design for a series of improvements along Juanita Drive Northeast.

The City expects to begin construction in spring 2024.

The improvements include a buffered bicycle lane and sidewalk between Northeast 120th and 132nd streets, a new turn lane at Northeast 120th Street, a set of rapid flashing beacons at Northeast 124th Street and intersection improvements at Northeast 128th and 132nd streets. The City postponed improvements at Northeast 112th Street.
