

AT YOUR HOME

Prevent Pollution

ONLY rain down the drain.



All storm drains in Kirkland flow to the nearest creek, lake or wetland. You can be subject to fines (KMC 15.52, 1.12.200) for allowing pollutants to enter storm drains.

YOU CAN KEEP POLLUTANTS OUT OF STORM DRAINS:

- Direct vehicle wash water to landscaped areas or sanitary sewer (toilet). Do not allow water to flow into storm drain.
- Fix vehicle leaks! Use drip pan to catch leaks.
- Pressure wash with cold water only (no soaps, no chemicals). Filter water and collect debris before it reaches a storm drain.
- Drain swimming pool, spa and hot tub water to landscaped area or sanitary sewer.
- Use pesticides sparingly, if at all, and use compost instead of fertilizer.
- Clear leaves and debris from nearby storm drains. Do not sweep or blow debris into street, drainage system, or waterways. This could clog drains and cause flooding.
- Pick up pet waste, bag it, and throw in trash.
