

Crag: brushed stainless steel **Scars**: Corten steel, rusted **Butterflies**: power coated

stainless steel

Feather: Corten, stainless





Cobalt















Bald eagle feather, 20" (actual size), will be tucked near base of crag.

Final placement TBD.

Material: Corten + stainless



















Cocoon: Corten steel, rusted **Reeds**: brushed stainless steel

Butterflies: power coated stainless steel









Raven feather, 12" (actual size), will be tucked near base of reeds. Final placement TBD.






Butterflies

- 6 different species of butterflies represent diversity of the Kirkland community
- We chose butterflies that are common to specific areas around the world where Kirkland's biggest immigrant populations come from
 - Plus butterflies common to the Puget Sound and Kirkland area
 - Diversity of shapes, colors, and sizes.















Common Rose

- Extensively distributed across Southern China / SE Asia
- The 'roses' are red-bellied swallowtails
- 3" 3.5" wingspan

Blue Morpho


- Mexico, Central & South America

- 5" 8" wingspan
















Monarch



 - 2" wingspan













