<u>Art Concept:</u> As a young Black and Latinx Kirkland resident and artist, I was proud to see our City Council pass Resolution R-5434, *Affirming that Black Lives Matter and Approving the Framework for Kirkland to Become a Safe, Inclusive and Welcoming Community*¹. I would like to take action to improve the safety and inclusion of Black People in Kirkland by painting a Black Lives Matter mural in the City of Kirkland that would also contribute to the vibrant art scene while supporting this resolution. Ideally, the mural would be located in a busy public area – such as on the side of the KTUB building by Peter Kirk Park, in the growing Totem Lake area, etc. – so that many residents and visitors could enjoy it. *My vision is to design and paint a mural that reflects the values of the current racial justice movement in our community*, and that brings other Black youth together to complete the mural.

<u>About the Artist</u>: I am a 22-year-old Black and Latinx female artist, activist, and resident of Kirkland. I love our city and am passionate about making our community a more safe, welcoming, and inclusive place for everyone. I have organized several racial justice events in our community and the greater Seattle region, including A Day to Learn Reforum, Sit Down and Listen: Amplifying Black Voices Reforum, Uncle Ikes Protest, Marches to City Hall, Black/Immigrants/Refugees Solidarity Rally, and more. I also
