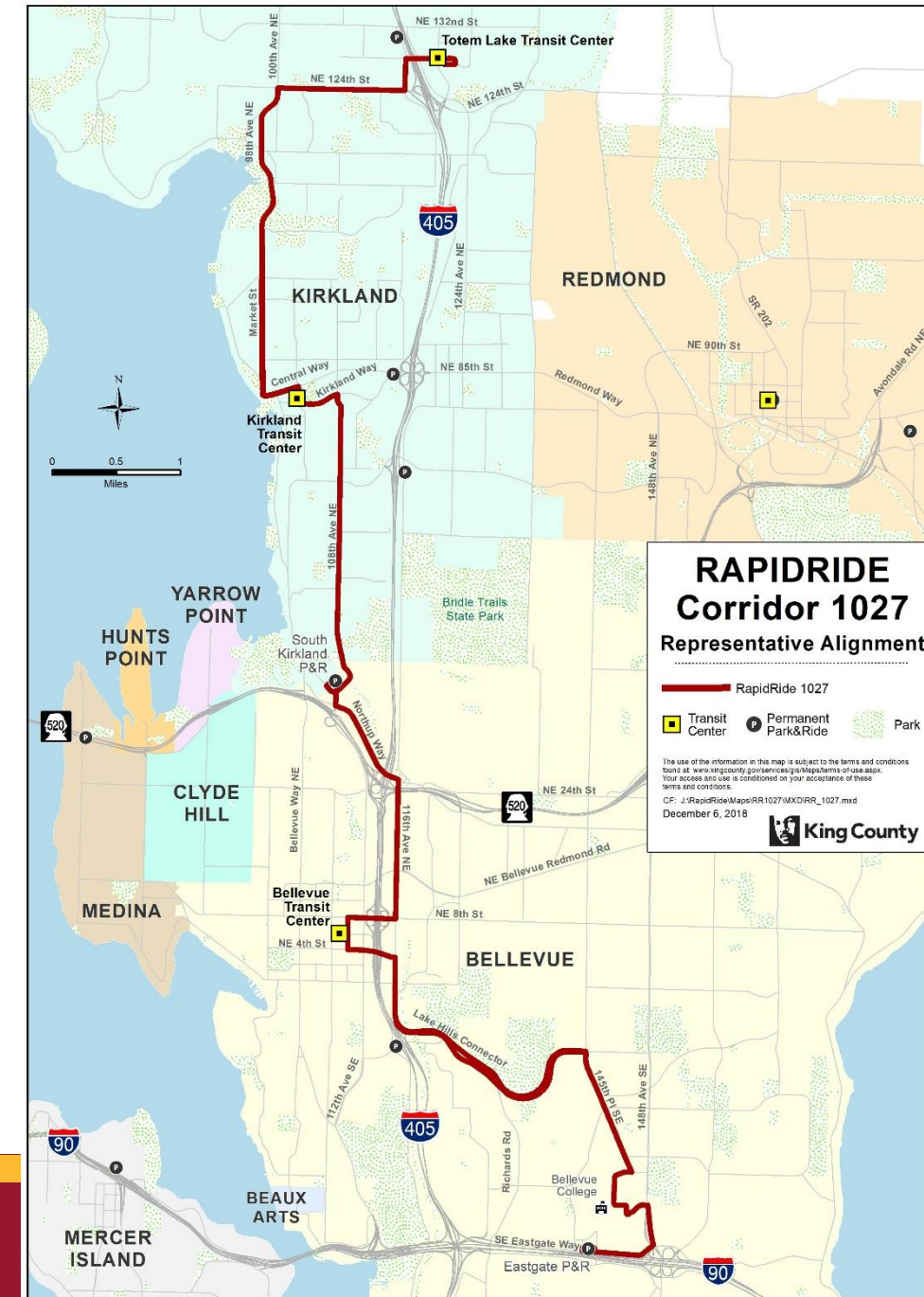

RapidRide 1027 Alignment

- Representative alignment:
 - Identified in METRO CONNECTS
 - Totem Lake to Eastgate
 - Portions of Routes 234, 235, 255, 271
- Based on NEMP input, Metro RapidRide and Service Planning evaluated an alternative endpoint to Downtown Redmond instead of Totem Lake



Evaluation Considerations

- Compare benefits/trade-offs of serving Redmond as opposed to Totem Lake (representative alignment)
 - If serving Redmond provides distinct advantages, conduct focused engagement to further inform decision process
 - Without distinct advantage, eliminate Redmond alternative from further study and evaluate options to serve Totem Lake

Conclusions

- Overall difference between options is not large enough to warrant shifting from METRO CONNECTS terminus in Totem Lake
- Maintain Totem Lake as northern focus
 - Consistent with METRO CONNECTS
- Conduct outreach around alternative pathways to/from Totem Lake
 - Via Juanita
 - Via Rose Hill
