# North Eastside Mobility Project (NEMP)

- Goal: Expand transit service and improve mobility in the north Eastside, and strengthen connections to important destinations
- Implemented March 2020 concurrent with pandemic
- Changes increased span and frequency, and improved travel time
- New routes have continued to grow ridership quickly

 Equitably inform, engage, and empower current and potential customers


#### **Deliver**

- Be consistent with Metro Connects, and current and future mobility needs






**East Link Connections** Phase 1- Equity Impact Review: Study Area Transit Routes and Equity Priority Areas



# East Link & Downtown Redmond Link extensions – the Link 2 Line

- Opens: 2023 & 2024
- Length: 17.4 miles; 12 stations
- **Service:** Every 8 minutes during peak hours.
- Projected travel times:
  - 18 min Downtown Redmond to Bellevue
  - 23 min Seattle to Bellevue
  - 50 min South Bellevue to Sea-Tac Airport

Routes: 250, 245, 225, 930, 256 (252/257/311), 931, 232, 237, 251

### Top prioritized needs:

- Improve and add local connections
- More service on nights and weekends
- Ensure transfers are easy and seamless
- Preserve easy access to downtown Seattle


#### **Kirkland connections:**


- Routes 250 and 245 frequent connections to Link
- Route 225 local connection to Overlake from Kingsgate, Totem Lake via 132<sup>nd</sup> Ave NE
- New evening and Saturday service on Route 930 Totem Lake to Redmond
- Consolidate peak-service on I-405 and provide a new connection to DT Seattle and SLU














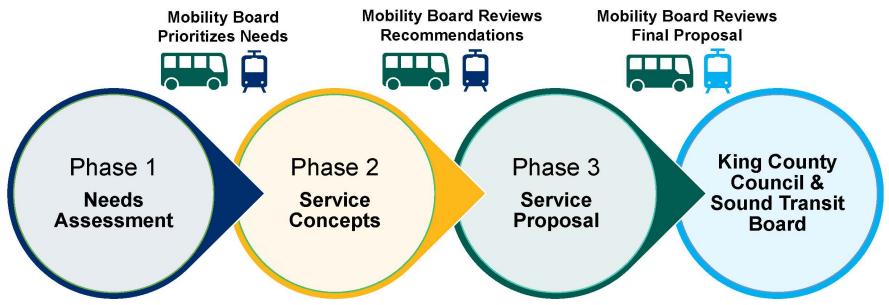




#### SR-520 Map (541/542/544/545)

- Conduct baseline equity analysis and analysis of existing service needs and barriers
- Convene Mobility Board and Partner Review Board

Feb - Spring 2021

- Develop and present service concepts based on prioritized needs
- · Solicit public feedback
- Learn more about community priorities
- · Review of concepts using
- Service Design Best Practices
- Public Input
- Equity Review

Summer - Fall 2021

- Present proposed changes to public
- Explain how the design matured and what influenced the concepts
- Seek feedback on ways to refine and optimize
- Final equity analysis

- King County Executive transmits final service network to King County Council for adoption
- Final service network to Sound Transit Board for adoption
- Plan for implementation and community education
