Additional Information for City of Kirkland Salary Commission

Car Allowance:

- Kirkland offers \$270/month for car allowance.
- Only 2 other comparator cities offer this benefit:
 - Bellevue: \$338.14/month
 - Spokane: \$40/month parking allowance
- City Manager's auto allowance was increased in 2023 to account for inflation over the years:
 - o 2022: \$425/month + mileage reimbursement for travel outside of 50 miles
 - 2023: \$620/month + mileage reimbursement for travel outside of 50 miles

Childcare:

• Childcare centers typically charge tuition monthly for full-time attendance. Below is a sampling of tuition costs at local Kirkland centers:

Low Income Stipend in Issaquah:

Background Email on New Low-Income Stipend for Councilmembers from the City of Issaquah's HR Department:

Our Commission wanted to add something meaningful that was also fiscally responsible and that wasn't a high enough number to potentially put other low-income benefits at risk (knowing that threshold may vary for each individual). Some of the factors considered in deciding on \$350/month were:

- Our existing Board and Commission low-income stipend of \$50/meeting. Our Council members generally have about 6 meetings per month between Council meetings, committee meetings, and regional meetings, and the Salary Commission wanted to at least match that per meeting amount but not go way beyond that amount.
- Cost of babysitting/child care for meetings. Our Commission considered that the cost of a babysitter is typically around \$21/hour, and wanted the stipend to be an amount that could cover a good portion of extra child care costs, if not necessarily all.
- Market comparison. The Commission did not want to add a stipend that would take our Council compensation way above that of comparable jurisdictions.
- Flat amount. The Commission wanted to do a flat amount for ease of administration.

Ultimately, they knew they were being a little experimental with the amount and that we'll have to see over the next few years what kind of impact the amount has and if it needs to be adjusted in any way by a subsequent Commission.
