### **ORDINANCE 0-4868**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO ESTABLISHING A UNIVERSAL LOW-INCOME RELIEF PROGRAM, CREATING A NEW CHAPTER OF THE KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE TO CODIFY THE UNIVERSAL LOW-INCOME RELIEF PROGRAM, AND REPEALING VARIOUS CODE PROVISIONS WITH MORE LIMITED LOW-INCOME RELIEF PROGRAMS.

WHEREAS, the Washington State Constitution, Article VII, Section 7, permits "support of the poor and infirm" by local governments; and

WHEREAS, since 1989, the City has operated a utility discount program that is open to low-income, single-family residential customers who are 62 years or older, blind, disabled, or on home kidney dialysis, but the program requires the person to be the bill holder, which prevents many residents who rent their residence from benefiting from the program; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes that low-income residents in particular are impacted by inflation, rising utility rates, and other increasing costs of living in the city, and further recognizes that an individual working at minimum wage currently needs to work 120 hours a week to afford a one-bedroom apartment on the Eastside; and

WHEREAS, the City Council wants to continue its efforts to support low-income residents who call Kirkland home and, to that end, desires to create a universal low-income relief program that discounts, reduces, or provides rebates for City utilities rates and from various City fees ensuring safeguards are in place to support a diverse and equitable community; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to have this new universal low-income relief program accessible for those who are eligible regardless of age, race, ethnicity, gender, marital status, education, employment, housing type, or disability status.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Kirkland do ordain as follows:

Section 1. The City Council hereby establishes a universal low-income relief program for those rates and fees charged and imposed beginning January 1, 2024. A new chapter, entitled "Low-Income Relief Program," shall be codified and added to Title 5 of the Kirkland Municipal Code (KMC) as chapter 5.90.

<u>Section 2</u>. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC, to be codified as KMC 5.90.010, to read as follows:

# 5.90.010 Kirkland Universal Low-Income Relief Program

The purpose of the City of Kirkland Universal Low-Income Relief Program is to promote more affordable living in the city and create a more equitable community through reductions of or rebates for certain City fees and charges.

<u>Section 3</u>. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC, to be codified as KMC 5.90.020, to read as follows:

#### 5.90.020 Definitions

For the purposes of this chapter, the following definitions apply:

"Director" means the Director of the Finance and Administration Department.

"Low-income household" means one or more adults and their dependents whose gross income does not exceed 80 percent of the median household income for King County, adjusted for household size.

"Low-income resident" means a person residing within the city of Kirkland whose gross income does not exceed 80 percent of the median household income for King County.

<u>Section 4</u>. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC, to be codified as KMC 5.90.030, to read as follows:

## 5.90.030 Administration.

- (a) The finance and administration department shall be responsible for implementing this chapter and the universal low-income relief program.
- (b) The Director shall have the authority to issue such rules and administrative procedures as may be necessary to implement this chapter.

<u>Section 5</u>. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC, to be codified as KMC 5.90.040, to read as follows:

### 5.90.040 Qualification.

(a) All applications for participation in any low-income relief program or claims for rebate under this chapter shall be submitted on a form approved by the Director and accompanied by that documentation required by the Director to establish eligibility. Applications or claims for rebate under this chapter must include a certification by the applicant or claimant that, under the penalty of perjury, all information provided in the application or claim is true and correct.

(d) All claims for rebate under this section must be submitted within six months following the month for which the rebate is requested. A qualified low-income household may submit multiple rebate requests together.

<u>Section 7</u>. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC, to be codified as KMC 5.90.060, to read as follows:

# 5.90.060 Discounted pet license rates and fees.

- (a) The pet license fee established by KMC 8.09.130 charged to a qualified low-income resident for an altered pet shall be discounted by the full cost of the license.
- (b) The pet license fee established by KMC 8.09.130 charged to a qualified low-income resident for an unaltered pet shall be discounted up to the cost of an altered pet license fee.
- (c) The transfer license fee established by KMC 8.09.130 charged to a qualified low-income resident shall be discounted up to the cost of an altered pet license fee.

<u>Section 8</u>. A new section shall be added to chapter 5.90 KMC, to be codified as KMC 5.90.070, to read as follows:

#### 5.90.070 Vehicle fee rebate.

- (a) A qualified low-income resident may request a fixed amount rebate of the city-imposed vehicle fee established by Ordinance O-4834, or a successor ordinance under chapter 19.22 KMC, by submitting an application at the specified time and must have personally paid the city-imposed vehicle fee.
- (b) The fixed amount rebate shall be twenty dollars (\$20.00)
- (c) All claims for rebate must be filed within the vehicle license period for which the rebate is requested.

	5.90.080 Discounted business license rates and fees.
	The basic license fee for the annual business license issued under chapter 7.02 KMC to be charged to a qualified low-income resident shall be fifty percent of the basic license fee established by KMC 7.02.120. No discount shall be applied to the applicable revenue generating regulatory license fee.
	Section 10. KMC 15.24.100, and the corresponding portions of Ordinance O-3766 § 5 (2000) and its predecessors, is hereby repealed.
	Section 11. KMC 16.12.025, and the corresponding portions of Ordinance O-3771 § 1 (2000) and its predecessors, is hereby repealed.
	<u>Section 12</u> . If any provision of this ordinance or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the remainder of the ordinance or the application of the provision to other persons or circumstances is not affected.
	Section 13. This ordinance shall be in force and effect on January 1, 2024, after its passage by the Kirkland City Council and publication, as required by law.

## PUBLICATION SUMMARY OF ORDINANCE NO. 4868

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND RELATING TO ESTABLISHING A UNIVERSAL LOW-INCOME RELIEF PROGRAM, CREATING A NEW CHAPTER OF THE KIRKLAND MUNICIPAL CODE TO CODIFY THE UNIVERSAL LOW-INCOME RELIEF PROGRAM, AND REPEALING VARIOUS CODE PROVISIONS WITH MORE LIMITED LOW-INCOME RELIEF PROGRAMS.

- <u>SECTION 1</u>. Establishes a universal low-income relief program beginning January 1, 2024, adding a new Chapter 5.90 to the Kirkland Municipal Code ("KMC").
- <u>SECTION 2</u>. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.010 entitled "Kirkland Universal Low-Income Relief Program."
- <u>SECTION 3</u>. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.020 related to definitions for the Chapter.
- $\underline{\text{SECTION 4}}.\quad \text{Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.030}$  related to the administration of the program.
- $\underline{\text{SECTION 5}}.$  Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.040 related to qualifications for the program.
- <u>SECTION 6</u>. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.050 related to the discounted utility rates and fees.
- <u>SECTION 7</u>. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.060 related to the discounted pet license rates and fees.
- <u>SECTION 8</u>. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.070 related to a vehicle fee rebate.
- <u>SECTION 9</u>. Adds a new KMC Section 5.90.080 related to discounted business license rates and fees.
  - SECTION 10. Repeals KMC Section 15.24.100.
  - SECTION 11. Repeals KMC Section 16.12.025.
  - <u>SECTION 12</u>. Provides a severability clause for the ordinance.
- SECTION 13. Authorizes publication of the ordinance by summary, which summary is approved by the City Council pursuant to Section 1.08.017 Kirkland Municipal Code and establishes the effective date as five days after publication of summary.
