RESOLUTION R-5636

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KIRKLAND DECLARING ITS INTENT TO CREATE AN OFFICIAL CITY FLAG AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO DEVELOP THE FLAG IN COLLABORATION WITH THE COMMUNITY AND CITY COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes the importance of fostering a strong sense of identity and civic pride within the Kirkland community; and

WHEREAS, an official City flag can serve as a vital and visible symbol to promote the City's and community's values; and

WHEREAS, the City's current, de facto flag was created quickly in response to a specific event in 2013, is not widely used in City materials, and does not follow best practices according to flag design experts; and

WHEREAS, an official City flag can contribute to Kirkland's identity and visibility, both regionally and nationally; and

WHEREAS, an official City flag can enhance Kirkland's sense of community and cohesion by serving as a unifying symbol that brings together the diverse communities that make up Kirkland and fostering a sense of belonging and mutual respect among all; and

WHEREAS, the design and adoption of an official City flag presents an opportunity to celebrate and incorporate elements of Kirkland's history and natural beauty; and

WHEREAS, the process of creating an official City flag should be fun, inspiring, and build community while embodying the City's values of being an inclusive, welcoming, and belonging community;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Kirkland as follows:

Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized and directed to conduct a comprehensive community engagement process in the creation of an official City flag. This process must include, but not be limited to, community meetings, workshops, an open design submission process, and the formation of a community advisory group.

<u>Section 2.</u> Following the community engagement process, options for a proposed new City flag should be provided to the City Council for consideration and potential adoption in 2025.

The submission and evaluation of flag designs must be guided by criteria combining the five basic principles for good flag design articulated by the North American Vexillological Association and two Kirkland-specific criteria, as follows: a. Keep it simple b. Use meaningful symbolism c. Use two to three basic colors d. Do not use lettering or seals e. Be distinctive f. Be related to Kirkland g. Be consistent with City values
