In addition, it is also serves the HS bus stop that collects students on the south side corner of NE 132^{nd} st. at 129^{th} Ave NE. Finally, the crosswalk also leads directly to a bus stop on the south side of 132^{nd} . Folks on the North side of the road need to get safely across an increasingly busy NE 132^{nd} , especially during the morning and evening commute times.
