




Percent of Population Born Outside of U.S.





In 2016, there were 236,000 petitions by employers for H-1B visas.

H-1B visas are capped at 85,000 per year.

In 2017, we hit the cap in 4 days.

Cities whose employers faced large numbers of denials in the H-1B visa lotteries experienced considerably less job creation and wage growth for American-born computer workers in the two years that followed.
