



Number of Each Sport/Program Completing Tool




Types of Fields Desired






Diamond Field, Rectangular Field, Small Open Space, or Large Open Space Desired

Do you desire a diamond field, rectangular field, small open space, or large open space




Support for Converting Existing Fields to Synthetic Turf






Support for Constructing New Synthetic Turf Fields

Ongoing Analysis (1 of 2)

Athletic field use & demand information provided by Kirkland staff being analyzed

- > Site Workshop conducting on-site analysis of athletic fields which includes:
 - > Current field playability condition
 - > Condition/availability/appropriateness of amenities to support the fields
 - > Safety concerns on/around the fields (lips at the start of outfields, broken fencing, ruts, mounds, etc.)
 - > Assessment of field maintenance to include turf, fencing, etc.
 - ➤ Overall field condition rank 1 excellent, 2 good, 3 poor and a total score as well as comments describing field issues that need to be addressed or suggested improvements.

Ongoing Analysis (2 of 2)

- > Analysis of needs assessment survey responses
- > On-going discussions with regional natural grass specialists
- > Future meeting with Athletic Field Users TBD


Natural Grass or Synthetic Turf?



Preliminary Observations from Our GRASP® Analysis

- Potential Upgrades to Synthetic Turf:
 - The backside at Juanita Beach needs severe attention and converting those (2) fields to synthetic would help.
 - The single diamond at Peter Kirk Park is unfunctional, and the park could be reconfigured to be more like Sandpoint's War Memorial Field (synthetic turf)
 - Terrace could be upgraded to synthetic turf
 - Fields (2) at Heritage could be converted to synthetic turf
 - Could convert the fields (2-4) at Crestwood to synthetic turf
 - Could convert the fields (2-3) at the Kirkland Middle school to synthetic turf
 - Could convert AG Bell, Sandburg, Hellen Keller, Thoreau, Muir (4-6) to synthetic turf
 - This has been done this at Lakeview Elementary
 - Robert Frost Elementary School is prime for synthetic turf upgrade
 - Finn Hill and Kamiakin Middle School fields (2-4) could be upgraded to synthetic turf

Early Preliminary Recommendations

- Through the City's partnership with the schools, convert/upgrade grass/dirt/gravel fields to multi-purpose regulation size synthetic fields with lights, especially the elementary schools to
 - Would provide improved field space for elementary school programming
 - Potential for prime programming time outside of school hours into the evenings
 - Typically parking already exists
 - Elementary schools are spread out across the City in many neighborhoods
- Consider development of one multi-purpose synthetic field complex with 4 fields
 - Would probably need to acquire that land and dedicate it to a complex
- Develop a schedule to provide a 6–8-week rest period for natural grass fields during a growing season

Sample Multi-Use Synthetic Turf Field









An Example of Kirkland's Expansion of Access to Athletic Fields is occurring at 132nd Street Field

- Conversion of grass field to synthetic turf in conjunction with the storm water vault.
- This expands the use with additional sports but also extends the time of day with lighting and during inclement weather.
- Field accommodates two diamond fields, soccer, lacrosse and other field sports.



This rendering depicts the 132nd Square Park renovation, which begins June 28th and will close the park for approximately one year. The labyrinth shown will not be installed with this project.

Diversity, Equity, Inclusion – Considerations

The City will need to consider Diversity, Equity and Inclusion related to location of synthetic turf fields.

• The athletic field user groups desire multiple fields in one location (a field complex) to host tournaments which contrasts with placing fields throughout the community.

Policy for allocation of fields – how does diversity, equity and inclusion factor in?

Deciding upon a field design (rectangular, diamond, combination) and how it allows the City to foster equity and diversity in sports offerings.
