ADMINISTRATION

PARKS BALLOT MEASURE(S) INITIATIVE


The Parks Funding Exploratory Committee (PFEC) met twice during January. The group reviewed 22 potential parks ballot measure elements and related capital and operating cost information. These potential elements are based on priorities identified in the 2022 Parks, Recreation and Open Space (PROS) Plan, which incorporated community input from over 4,700 community members, analysis of current recreation programming, and analysis of the current park system by consultants and staff. On January 26, PFEC received the results of the recreation facility feasibility study from Opsis Architecture and consultants. The Opsis team shared conceptual designs for community and recreation facilities at Houghton Park and Ride site and at the North Kirkland Community Center location.



PFEC is working towards making recommendations to City Council in March 2023 for potential parks ballot measure(s). Review presentations from past meetings and learn more about PFEC on the <u>Parks Ballot Initiative website</u>.

FACILITY FEASIBILITY STUDY

Alongside the PFEC process, the City has contracted with Opsis Architecture to develop a robust recreation facility feasibility study grounded on the community needs identified in the 2022 PROS Plan. Opsis Architecture shared their final feasibility concepts and costing for facilities at the Houghton Park and Ride site and the North Kirkland Community Center location at the January 26, 2023 PFEC meeting. Final concepts will be shared with City Council at their February 21, 2023 study session.



HUMAN SERVICES

SEVERE WEATHER HOTEL VOUCHER PROGRAM KICKS OFF

Cold weather season has kicked off and so has the City's severe weather hotel voucher program. Through dedicated funding and partnership with the Baymont Inn, first responders and programs supporting those experiencing homelessness can provide residents or shelter workers with a temporary hotel voucher to use during severe weather incidents throughout the winter season. Since the season began, 15 vouchers have been distributed, totaling 43 nights of temporary shelter to support 20 residents.

HUMAN SERVICES TEAM EXPANDS TO INCLUDE OUTREACH TO THOSE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS

As part of the 2023-24 budget process, the City Manager recommended adding a full-time position to expand the City's role in providing outreach services to residents experiencing homelessness. While the position is new to the City, the Human Services team previously supported Catholic Community Services, to fund a dedicated homelessness outreach position. Staff are eager to build upon the program learnings to develop and implement the City's strategy on building relationships and connecting residents who are unhoused with community resources. PARK MANAGEMENT

KICKING OFF THE NEW YEAR IN OUR PARKS!

The crews often use January to catch up on training and inventory management when they aren't managing snow and ice and cleaning up after storms. Here are some maintenance crew highlights from the first month of the year:

BALLFIELDS/CEMETERY

- Mulched tree rings at Everest.
- Edged and trimmed around tables, benches, pathways, and fence lines at Forbes Creek and Peter Kirk.
- Cleared leaves and debris from the parking lot and fencelines at Crestwoods.
- Repaired turf at Peter Kirk and Crestwoods.
- Pressure washed the tennis courts at Heritage Park.
- Implemented multiple burial services and internments.



HORTICULTURE

- Installed hose connection at McAuliffe for watering access in the natural areas.
- Mulched tree rings at Reservoir.
- Installed additional garbage can by playground at Mark Twain.
- Pruned and weeded beds at Marsh.
- Weeded and added wood chips to the beds around the Transit Center at Peter Kirk.
- Cleaned waterfowl waste from pathways at Brink and Marina.

SUPPORT

- Installed new cameras at the Peter Kirk restrooms.
- Repaired fence at Edith Moulton that was damaged by fallen trees.
- Installed off-leash dog park at Snyders Corner.
- Repaired drinking fountain in dugout at Peter Kirk.
- Installed concrete bases for the bench to the north of the picnic shelter at Everest.







NATURAL AREAS/GREEN KIRKLAND PARTNERSHIP

- Installed fencing around large trees at Totem Lake to protect them from beavers.
- Treated invasive trees at McAuliffe, Crestwoods, Watershed, Totem Lake, and the cemetery.
- Cleaned sand from drains and outfalls at Juanita Beach
- Brushcut blackberry at Kingsgate and JU1 in preparation for manual removal of root balls by volunteers
- Supported volunteer events at four locations on MLK Jr. Day with tools, plants, and supplies.
- Edged around tables, benches, and pathways at Josten, Hazen Hills, Edith Moulton, NRHW, and Juanita Bay.

PARK PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Below is a high-level summary and status update of the active Park Planning and Development projects. Please visit the Park Planning and Development <u>WEBSITE</u> to learn more about these projects.

132ND SQUARE PARK

The park is almost ready! Substantial completion is scheduled for March 17 with a Grand Re-opening Celebration scheduled for April 1, 2023. In addition to the new synthetic turf field, the park will have expanded parking, sports lighting, a new playground with a zip line, a play hill, a labyrinth and improved walking paths.

Background: The City is replacing a non-regulation grass sports field with a synthetic turf field after the installation of a surface water detention structure underneath the field. Construction started on June 28, 2021.



JUANITA BEACH BATHHOUSE

In November 2022, Kirkland's Juanita Beach Park Bathhouse was recognized as a 2022 Honor Award Honorable Mention from the American Institute of Architects Seattle Chapter. The Honor Awards for Washington Architecture celebrate excellence in design in Washington. The Juanita Beach Park Bathhouse was chosen by the jury as one of the 15 award winners that "delight, inspire and enrich their communities all while having a positive impact on the environment." Other awards received by the bathhouse project include the 2022 Facilities Spotlight Award from the Washington Recreation and Park Association, the 2022 Civic Design Award from the American Institute of Architects Washington Council and the 2021 Project of the Year Award for Structures Under \$5 Million from the Washington Chapter of the American Public Works Association.

MARINA PARK SHORELINE RENOVATIONS

Staff has begun working with Reid-Middlton, a local engineering firm, to review existing conditions and identify solutions for either repair or replacement of shoreline structures.

Background: In late 2022, a portion of the sidewalk and stairs at Marina Park experienced significant subsidence. Shoreline structures at Marina Park were previously evaluated in the 2019 Kirkland Shoreline Structures Assessment Report.

OO DENNY PARK PICNIC SHELTER

Staff has begun analyzing the site to add an additional picnic shelter. Cost estimating and required permits are being evaluated.

Background: This project will use existing funds remaining from the Finn Hill Park District.

POP-UP DOG PARK PROGRAM

Staff prepared a Legislative Request Memo for the January 17 Council Meeting regarding options for the pop-up dog park at Snyder's Corner. Council approved a phased re-opening of the temporary pop-up dog park at Snyder's Corner. The first phase consisting of a 15,000 square foot facility without parking was installed the week of January 23, 2023.

Background: These temporary pop-up dog parks are intended to test and evaluate how to incorporate dog off-leash areas into our system.

RECREATION SERVICES

2022-2023 YOUTH BASKETBALL GAMES

January 14, 2023, marked the start of games for the 2022-2023 Kirkland Parks & Community Services 3rd-6th Grade Youth Basketball League. Games held on the first day were considered scrimmages to allow the teams and staff the opportunity to become familiar with the game environment. 40 teams participated in scrimmages and the day was a huge success! This is the first time since early 2020 that four games were played all at the same time across the two gyms at Kamiakin and Kirkland Middle Schools. A huge thank you to the teams for their patience as we all learned and got back into the swing of things again!



On January 25, the Kirkland Senior Council hosted a sold-out property tax relief public forum. King County Tax Assessor John Wilson spoke at the Peter Kirk Community Center to explain the eligibility requirements for Senior/Disabled Property Tax Relief and to answer related questions. There are an estimated 26,000 qualified seniors in King County that have yet to register for the current senior property tax exemption. KIRKLAND STEPPER'S 20TH ANNIVERSARY




WELCOME JAZMINE QUINTERO


