NATIONAL PARKS AND RECREATION MONTH – WHERE COMMUNITY GROWS

During July, Kirkland celebrated Parks and Recreation month and recognized the importance of parks and recreation in building strong, vibrant, and resilient communities by bringing people together, providing essential services, and fostering the growth of our communities.

Kirkland Parks and Community Services grows the Kirkland community in multiple ways. The department provides over 2,000 recreation classes and programs for nearly 20,000 people of all ages and abilities to grow healthier. Kirkland Parks Management team and Green Kirkland Partnership volunteers are environmental stewards and manage more than 698 acres of parks and green space. Kirkland Parks and Community services provides seasonal and part-time jobs for over 200 people annually as lifeguards, swim instructors, camp counselors, groundskeepers, park rangers and more. We have been a 'first job' for many Kirkland youth and are grateful for all those who spend their time learning and growing with us.

Here are two notable projects where the department grew community during July:

CELEBRATE KIRKLAND JULY 4 PARADE

The 24th annual Celebrate Kirkland July 4 parade was a remarkable display of community unity attended by 30,000 spectators. With the active involvement of all city departments, the event showcased various entries, including beloved favorites like Kirkland Heritage Society and the Kirkland Sea Hawkers. The parade's tagline, "Where We Come Together," was exemplified by the presence of three grand marshals: Dr. Catherine Cushinberry, CEO of Hopelink; Lani Brockman, Artistic Director for Studio East; and Austin Picinich, a talented mural artist and graduate of Juanita High School. The parade paid tribute to veterans in classic cars, featured City Councilmembers in an antique fire truck, and celebrated 100 years of Kenworth trucks. The day was made even more special with giveaways for kids and the Kids Parade, featuring approximately 2,000 kids and families. Additionally, this year's parade featured new entries that celebrated the community's diversity, with active participation from the Ukrainian, Brazilian, and Pakistani communities. ADMINISTRATION

PARKS 2023 BALLOT EXPLORATION

City Council discussed the potential ballot measure during its July 5, 2023 meeting and then during its July 18, 2023 meeting, the Kirkland City Council adopted Ordinance O-4857 as a response to the needs and priorities identified by the community for accelerated investment in expanded aquatics, parks, and recreation facilities. This ordinance builds on the input received from over 4,700 community members during the 2022 Parks, Recreation and Open Space (PROS) Plan process, 45 community members who constituted the Parks Funding Exploratory Committee, the Kirkland Park Board, and the Kirkland Youth Council. Ordinance O-4857 submits to Kirkland voters for the November 2023 ballot a levy lid lift proposition to expand aquatics, parks, and recreation facilities, operations, and programs. If approved, Kirkland's regular property tax levy would increase by approximately \$0.28054/\$1,000 of assessed valuation (AV) to a maximum total rate of \$1.38386/\$1,000 AV, generating approximately \$10,800,000 for these purposes in 2024. HUMAN SERVICES

PERMANENT SUPPORTIVE HOUSING NOW OPEN ON THE EASTSIDE

July celebrated the grand opening of Plymouth Crossing, the Eastside's first permanent supportive housing, in Bellevue's Eastgate neighborhood. The facility includes 92 studio apartments for single adults, plus 3 live-in staff apartments. Permanent supportive housing is intended for individuals experiencing chronic homelessness and provides onsite support to connect residents with services including case management and behavioral health. Plymouth Crossing is part of the Eastgate Housing Campus, which is an innovative partnership that also includes shelter and affordable housing.

2023 KIRKLAND HEALTH & WELLNESS FAIR - SAVE THE DATE

In partnership with the King County Promotores Network, the third annual Kirkland Health and Wellness Fair will take place on Saturday, September 16, 2023 from 10am to 2pm at Juanita High School. This FREE event is open to all and will offer a variety of services including vaccinations, flu shots, health screenings, dental services, information, and resources. PARK PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Below is a high-level summary and status update of the active Park Planning and Development projects. Please visit the Park Planning and Development <u>WEBSITE</u> to learn more about these projects.

132ND SQUARE PARK

A grand re-opening celebration was held on Saturday, July 15, 2023 with over 400 people in attendance.

Background: The City replaced a non-regulation grass sports field with a synthetic turf field after the installation of a surface water detention structure underneath the field. Construction started on June 28, 2021.

MARINA PARK SHORELINE RENOVATIONS

Designers provided preliminary concepts and options for repairs or replacement of dock and shoreline structures. Staff is moving forward with repairs to the south

fingers and pier along with a few upland repairs and improvements. The consultant is working to develop the contract for the next phase of design work.

Background: In late 2022, a portion of the sidewalk and stairs at Marina Park experienced significant subsidence. Shoreline structures at Marina Park were evaluated and identified for repairs in the 2019 Kirkland Shoreline Structures Assessment Report.



PARK RESTROOM REPLACEMENTS

Restrooms at Houghton Beach and Everest parks are planned for replacement due to their age and condition. Staff is working to create a scope of work for this project. *Background*: This capital project repairs or replaces park restrooms in the system.

TOTEM LAKE PARK

Three cantilever shade structures will be installed this fall near the playground to provide relief from sunny days. *Background*: In July 2021 the City opened Totem Lake Park as its newest neighborhood park with an inclusive playground, restrooms, and a boardwalk connecting the park to the Cross Kirkland Corridor.

SPECIAL EVENT SERVICES

Staff supported the activities listed below through permitting; coordination with other City departments for street closures, Fire and Police support, safety and sanitary regulations, and banners; City facility use such as parks, parking lots and streets, evening and weekend on-call logistical support as needed; and communication with the public. JUANITA FRIDAY MARKET

BALLFIELDS/CEMETERY

- Restored the upper field at 132nd Park as this was not part of the CIP renovation project.
- Perfected the fields at Everest Park and hosted the Little League World Series.
- Installed new bleachers at Everest Park.
- Set up and took down the sprinkler park at Peter Kirk Park.
- Repaired the mound and leveled the batter's box at Lee Johnson Field at Peter Kirk Park.
- Provided support for the 4th of July parade before, during, and after the event.

MOBILE REC

The van has stopped at Juanita Beach, Crestwoods, Edith Moulton and Kamiakin Middle School so far, bringing fun, games, and art at every stop. The van will be on the move each Friday in the summer through August 25, 2023.

SPRINKLER PARK

July is the kickoff of the summer's annual Sprinkler Park season. Sprinkler Park takes place on Thursdays at Lee Johnson Field from 11 am-2pm from July 6 through August 10. This free event is for kids of all ages, offering water tables, water toys, "Buckets of Fun", and sprinklers galore. Sprinkler Park is staffed by our certified lifeguard team.

PEE WEE SOCCER REGISTRATION OPENED

On July 12, 2023, hundreds of families raced to register for the Fall season of Pee Wee Soccer. In record time, 240 spots for youth ages three through six were filled. Now that 132nd Square Park is open, staff can expand the program to 360 spots and are recruiting volunteer coaches and officials.
