The 25th annual Celebrate Kirkland July Fourth parade was an amazing display of community unity attended by over 25,000 spectators. The parade was a vibrant showcase of beloved community groups such as the Kirkland Heritage Society and the Kirkland Sea Hawkers and exciting performances.

This year, the committee selected Doug Davis as the parade grand marshal this year. A distinguished US Navy Submarine Service veteran, Doug has been a pillar of the Kirkland community, serving in leadership roles for the Kirkland Chamber of Commerce, the Kirkland Downtown Association, and more.

To commemorate the parade's 25th anniversary, entertainment

HUMAN SERVICES

KIRKLAND HOSTS FAITH COMMUNITY HOMELESSNESS SYMPOSIUM

The City of Kirkland hosted a Faith Community Homelessness Symposium on July 18, 2024 where Eastside faith leaders were invited to participate in a roundtable discussion to inform the City's new Homelessness Continuum of Care Action Plan. The purpose of the action plan is to ensure the City can provide a compassionate, human-centered response to unhoused residents in Kirkland. Recognizing that faith communities play a critical role in addressing the challenges of homelessness, the City welcomed feedback from faith leaders on what is working well, where they observe gaps and needs, and how the City and faith communities can form closer partnerships to best support unsheltered Kirkland residents.

NEW LEADERSHIP FOR HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION

Congratulations to the new Chair and Vice Chair of the Human Services Commission for 2024-2025. Gabriela "Gaby" Lopez Vazquez is the new Chair. PARK PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT

Below is a high-level summary and status update of the active Park Planning and Development projects. Please visit the Park Planning and Development **WEBSITE** to learn more about these projects.

EVEREST PARK PLAY AREA REPLACEMENT

Everest Park playground has been identified as the next playground to be replaced for the benefit of the community. Staff is working with a playground manufacturer to develop three concepts and cost estimates to be discussed with the community this fall.

Background of the Project: This ongoing capital project fund strives to replace aging playgrounds and improve sports courts in the parks throughout the system.

FISK FAMILY PARK

In May 2024, the Park Board and Kirkland Parks and Community Foundation finalized a site plan for the property as well as stabilization of the "little red cottage". Staff has replaced the roof of the cottage and performed other minor security and structural support. This tiny site is highly constrained by stream buffer requirements which limit development. As such, a soft-surface trail and picnic tables are planned for the site. Additionally, staff is reviewing a potential small picnic shelter to be placed in the small buildable area.


Background of the Project: The City acquired new property adjacent to the Cross Kirkland Corridor in late 2023 and will create a plan to guide the future of the new park.

HOUGHTON AND EVEREST RESTROOM REPLACEMENT

The restroom building at Houghton Park is planned for replacement. During the scoping process, staff identified opportunities to analyze the building's current location and potential for programmatic improvements. Staff has contracted with a consultant to develop preliminary 10% design options and costing for further consideration. Design is underway.

The restroom building at Everest Park is planned for design in 2024 and construction in 2025 due to its age and condition. Staff has contracted with a consultant to develop design and construction drawings. Design is underway and has reached 60% design.

Background of the Project: This capital project repairs or replaces park restrooms in the system. Restrooms at Houghton and Everest Restrooms have been identified for replacement due to their age and condition.

MARINA PARK SHORELINE RENOVATIONS

The project has been refined to focus on repairs to the south fingers and pier along with a few upland repairs and modest path and amenity improvements. The consultant finalized 60% drawings which were presented to City Council on June 18, 2024. Staff received direction to continue designs to 90% and return with refined cost estimates and a funding plan.

Background of the Project: Shoreline structures at Marina Park were evaluated and identified for repairs in the 2019 Kirkland Shoreline Structures Assessment Report. In late 2022, a portion of the sidewalk and stairs at Marina Park experienced significant subsidence.

O.O. DENNY PARK PICNIC SHELTER

A new additional picnic shelter has been designed and will be constructed in proximity to the existing shelter, adding capacity for the community. The project is currently in permitting with bidding in the fall.

Background of the Project: Addition of a picnic shelter using funds transferred from the Finn Hill Park District.

PARK MANAGEMENT & OPERATIONS

WORLD CLASS SOFTBALL AND BASEBALL

July brought another year of hosting the Little League Softball World Series at Everest Park along with many other important tournaments and leagues. Our Ballfields/Cemetery team, with help from the rest of the division, were very busy making every game count (even the rainy ones) while also helping to host Celebrate Kirkland and keeping up with our busy summertime parks! Here are monthly highlights from our four crews:

BALLFIELDS/CEMETERY

- Prepped fields in all weather conditions to support the Little League Softball World Series.
- Pressure washed the dugouts at Everest in preparation for the Little League Softball World Series.
- Aerated and fertilized fields and weeded the warning tracks in preparation for the Little League Softball World Series.
- Repaired broken irrigation at all sites as needed.
- Mowed and trimmed all sports fields at least weekly.
- Performed services and internments at the cemetery.
- Facilitated the skate park and bike track at the Houghton Park and Play.

HORTICULTURE

- Pruned trees for tree health and risk mitigation at Peter Kirk, OO Denny, Everest, Brookhaven, and Juanita Bay parks.
- Repaired irrigation, including extensive repairs for the mitigation areas at Totem Lake Park.
- Mulched tree rings at OO Denny Park.
- Weeded the beds at Brink, Marsh, and Heritage parks.
- Repaired the fountain at Brink Park.
- Pressure washed picnic shelters at most locations.
- Removed vegetation along the rock wall at Heritage Park for view corridors into the parking lot.
- Installed vegetation in the beds around Heritage Hall.

SUPPORT

- Removed a plant bed blocking the entrance to the Kirkland Teen Union Building.
- Installed large rocks at Heritage and OO Denny to protect the parks from cars.
- Began sunshade installation at Houghton Park and Play.
- Replaced the inlet cover at the pool.
- Repaired decking at the Marina boat launch after it was damaged by a stranded boat.
- Installed a new drinking fountain on the north side of Juanita Beach Park.
- Repaired a broken post at Snyder's parking area.
- Replaced broken faucets at Peter Kirk Park.

NATURAL AREAS/GREEN KIRKLAND PARTNERSHIP

- Watered hundreds of trees and shrubs in natural areas.
- Installed irrigation for native plant beds at Everest Park.
- Pressure washed the picnic shelters and art at Juanita Beach Park.
- Added woody debris along the creek at Fisk Family Park.
- Installed umbrellas in the beach at Juanita Beach Park.
- Weeded the beds around the playground at Carillon Woods.
- Redistributed the chips and repaired the fencing at the Juanita Beach dog park.






