4. Discussion: Funding a program modeled after Geek Out Gold and/or a multijurisdictional extension of Geek Out Gold

Hold discussion on incentivized hotel program based on last month's presentation by Bullseye Creative cofounder Peter Klauser. Geek Out Gold incentivizes hotel stays by providing "Geek Out Gold" certificates which can be spent at participating businesses. For discussion: potential timing, program scope, possible funding sources.

5. Discussion: New Explore Kirkland Tourism video

Discuss the idea of creating a new Explore Kirkland Tourism video (to replace the video made by the City in 2013) as a potential strategy to re-energize the tourism program and draw guests to Kirkland. The TDC may pitch this idea to the City Council to help guide its decision making as it works to allocate impending federal relief act funding to various recovery-based initiatives.



6. Discussion: Potential busking regulation
