Early City Response

- Assessed needs:
 - Lost revenue due to cancelled fundraising events
 - Some programs had immediate additional costs to be able to provide services safely
 - Some programs unable to offer services safely
 - Immediate need for increased food and financial assistance

Early City Response

- Created Human Services Stabilization Fund
 - Emergency homeless services
 - Emergency financial assistance
 - Emergency food assistance
- Created food hotline and delivery program with Sound Generations
- Sent out mailing with 3 key resources in 4 languages

CARES Act CDBG-CV Funds

- Bellevue, Kirkland and Redmond collaborated to determine and address the needs of providers of emergency shelter and day center services
 - Kirkland—family shelter \$224,436
 - Redmond—young adult shelter \$212,736
 - Bellevue—women and men shelters split \$489,623

State CARES Act funding

- \$30 per capita available for reimbursement
- City Manager recommended and City Council agreed to use the money for 3 purposes:
 - City General Operations
 - Human Services Needs
 - Small Business Assistance

Residential Financial Assistance & Cultural Navigation

- Financial assistance for rent and mortgage
- Targeted outreach to Black, African-American, Latinx, and Indigenous communities
- Partnership with small culturally responsive community-based partners

- Stakeholder Mapping
- Project Design (draft surveys and outreach plan)
- Preparation and Training for Promotores (trusted messengers)
- Outreach and Community Engagement
- Report Out and Back

Outreach to Indigenous, Black, and African-American residents

- Partnerships with existing organizations and programming across social services, schools, and community-led initiatives
- Informal information gathering and resource sharing
- Strengthening culturally responsive services, programs, and outreach

Fair Housing Testing and Training

- Fair housing training for Kirkland shelter and affordable housing staff
- Fair housing testing at Kirkland properties

COVID Day Centers

 Support additional day centers to serve women and families with children not moving into Kirkland Place for Families and Women

Reimbursements

- Reimbursements to agencies for additional expenses (PPE, tech, supplies) in collaboration with the City of Redmond
 - Alpha Supported Living Services
 - Babies of Homelessness
 - Community Homes, Inc.
 - Eastside Baby Corner
 - Hopelink
 - LifeWire

Childcare scholarships

- Scholarships for Kirkland affordable housing residents and contacts through cultural navigation
- Targeted assistance to families ineligible for other 100% scholarships
