The City of Kirkland is returning a center median with pedestrian signals for the crossing of Slater/132nd Avenues Northeast at the Cross Kirkland Corridor trail. A new right-turn signal will also be added at NE 124th Street for pedestrian safety.

Work begins on pedestrian safety project

Project creates a signalized crossing for walking and biking at the northern terminus of the Cross Kirkland Corridor trail

WHAT: A City of Kirkland contractor will begin pedestrian and bicycle safety improvements at Slater /132nd Avenues Northeast for the Cross Kirkland Corridor. Returning the center island median, this project creates a signalized crossing of the Cross Kirkland Corridor to King County's Eastrail. Additionally, a right-turn signal will be added to the westbound to northbound movement at NE 124th Street. Slater/132nd Avenues Northeast will also receive enhanced bicycle safety features including lane buffers and access to the trail.

WHEN: Construction is expected to begin on Monday, May 12. OMA Construction of Maple Valley expects to work between 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. Monday thru Friday. Construction is expected to be complete within 70 working days, with final completion expected in November. Due to long-lead procurement

processes, this project could have periods of inactivity, but we strive to complete this project as quickly as possible.

WHAT TO EXPECT: The contractor is required to maintain access for emergency responders, mail delivery, local residents and businesses. Drivers should plan for traffic delays during construction. A detour for trail users will bypass the construction zone and will be posted on the trails and website.




