PAINTING Paints & Stains Pollute



All storm drains in Kirkland flow to the nearest creek, lake, or wetland. It is illegal to allow paint, stains, or painting equipment rinse water to enter a storm drain and/or surface and groundwater (KMC15.52). Property owners, paint contractors, and/or other responsible parties can be subject to fines (KMC 1.12.200).

PAINT CLEAN-UP

- Dispose of rinse water in sink, sanitary sewer clean-out, or toilet
- Never wash equipment or dump rinse water in streets, storm drains, or ditches
- Never leave paint cans or equipment outside

PAINT DISPOSAL

- Latex and oil-based household paint, stains, and varnish in containers up to 5 gallons in size
 - Recycle for free through PaintCare.

- Paint thinner and stripper
 - Never dispose in trash
 - Dispose at a hazardous waste facility. Find locations at *kingcountyhazwasteWA.gov*

If You Spill... It's Your Responsibility to Promptly Clean Up

- Keep spill clean up materials nearby
 - For home projects, use kitty litter or other absorbent materials
 - Painting professionals should have a spill-kit on-hand



• Call 425-587-3900 to report spills that enter a storm drain. Fines may be reduced or waived if self-reported
