Corylus cornuta Beaked Hazelnut	20/10	•		•	•	•	•	•		Slow-growing, the Beaked Hazelnut forms attractive clumps and provides food for wildlife.
Gaultheria shallon Salal	2/4		•	•	•	•	•		•	Dark, glossy leaves. Berries provide food for birds. Highly desirable and easily available.
Holodiscus discolor Oceanspray	15/10	•		•	•	•	•			Delicate creamy white flowers. Good for sunny, dry soil habitat and riparian restoration projects.

Philadelphus lewisii Mock Orange	12/9	•		•	•	•	•			Fragrant flowers and thick branching used as nesting habitat.
Physocarpus capitatus Pacific Ninebark	12/10	•			•	•	•			Large, spreading, versatile shrub with white flowers that makes great habitat.
Ribes sanguineum Red Flowering Currant	6/4	•		•			•		•	Blooms May through June with white to dark pink flowers. Highly desirable and easily available.
